## **HEALTH PROTOCOLS**

## **Daily Campus Sanitation**

The campus, classrooms, and offices will be cleaned and disinfected on a routine and frequent basis. Surfaces touched by multiple people will be cleaned and disinfected at least daily to reduce the exposure to COVID-19.

## Hygiene & Health

Frequent hand-washing will be encouraged. Additional hand washing stations will be available. Hand sanitizer stations will be available around campus. If a student shows COVID-19 symptoms, they will be sent to a designated quarantine area for pick-up within the hour. Department of Health guidelines will be followed for cleaning and sanitation. Any student sent home due to illness should be excluded from school until symptom-free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.

## Social distancing

Classroom spaces will be configured to allow 6 feet of distance. Occupancy will be capped according to room configuration. Recess and lunch times will be staggered to limit the mixing of students. At this time, we will be restricting visitors to the school environment.

## **Face Coverings**

Masks or shields of appropriate size shall be properly worn to fully cover the mouth and nose, at all times. Teachers may allow students to remove their masks when academically appropriate or when students are eating; however, a six foot physical distance must be maintained during that time.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### When/how will we receive devices for at home learning?

Students in grades 3-6 will receive their Chromebooks on their first "Face-to-face" day.

Students in Kindergarten-2nd grade will start off with learning packets and receive an iPad in the near future.

# How many hours are students required to engage in distance learning on their "at home" days?

This will depend on your child's individual teacher and grade level. When your child comes to school, one of our main priorities will be to help your child understand what distance learning will look like. Your child's kumu will go over expectations, routines, and a system that will help your child to be successful while learning at home. Your child's kumu will also communicate with you, via ClassDojo or Google Classroom, the work that will need to be completed while at home.

#### When will we be notified of our child's cohort assignment?

Your child's kumu will notify you of your child's cohort assignment during your meet & greet appointment.

# At home learning for our 'ohana/my child is not ideal. Can our keiki come to school every day?

We understand that the blended learning model is not ideal for all families. Unfortunately, with our numbers and the size of our classrooms, it is not possible for us to have all students on campus while still maintaining a 6 foot distance.

#### Will my child have to wear a mask at school?

Yes. Masks or shields of appropriate size shall be properly worn to fully cover the mouth and nose, at all times. Teachers may allow students to remove their masks when academically appropriate or when students are eating; however, a six foot physical distance must be maintained during that time.

Parents/guardians are responsible for providing a clean mask daily. We will have disposable masks available for students who don't bring their own.

### Will there be any field trips this school year?

Unfortunately, for safety reasons, there will not be any field trips this school year.



#### What is the procedure/policy for sick children?

All parents/guardians should conduct a wellness check on their child each morning using the following symptom checklist:

Feverish or unusually warm (has flushed cheeks)
Coughing/sneezing
Sore throat
Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing
Headache/stomach ache/nausea
Muscle pain/unusual fatigue

☐ New loss of taste or smell

If any of these symptoms are present, your child should not attend school.

Upon arrival, members will interview and visually inspect all individuals (from at least 6 feet away) using the symptom checklist above.

If a student shows any of these symptoms throughout the school day, they will be sent to a designated quarantine area for pick-up within the hour. Department of Health guidelines will be followed for cleaning and sanitation. Any student sent home due to illness should be excluded from school until symptom-free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.

#### Will there be a COVID 19 testing regimen for staff?

All staff will be screened using the same symptom checklist above. If any of the above symptoms are present, the staff member will be sent home and will not return to school until symptom-free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.

#### Will I be allowed to volunteer in my child's classroom?
